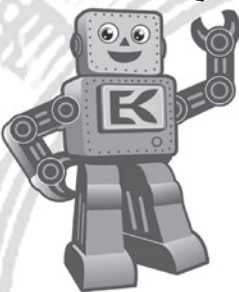

Soccer Update!!

New Soccer Programming & "D" League coming soon.....

We would like to take this opportunity to introduce a new program for children ages 2-5 called HappyFeet. HappyFeet is owned and operated by the ASTRA Soccer Academy and is designed to work in conjunction with SYSI Mini-Soccer. Please see the details below regarding HappyFeet.

Who: Classes for 2-3 year olds and 4-5 year olds

What: HappyFeet focuses on the acquisition of physical literacy and the development of gross motor skills while teaching children to master the ball from an early age. Through the use of stories, songs, nursery rhymes and childhood games, children begin to develop agility, balance, coordination, strength and flexibility. All classes are 30 minutes in length and each child has their own ball for the entire duration of the class. HappyFeet is essentially play time with a ball!

Where: New classes are constantly being added; www.happyfeetsask.ca to view the most current class locations.

When: HappyFeet classes run one day per week for a six week period. Summer classes are weekday evenings, while winter and fall classes often run weekend afternoons.

Cost: \$40.00 per six week block.

Under-10 Indoor Development (D) League – An enhanced developmental opportunity for interested players in the U10 age group that wish to improve their skill level in an optimal training environment overseen by Zone Technical Directors. The U10 D-League involves 10 games and a minimum of 20 practices from October to March.
