Traffic Review

Wildwood residents participated in two public consultation meetings regarding the City's 2017 Neighbourhood Traffic Review for Wildwood. On April 16, 2018, the Utilities & Transportation department submitted its final Neighbourhood Traffic Report Review for Wildwood. Residents were provided with a short summary of the findings in a letter in July 2018. The full report is available at www.saskatoon.ca/ntr (scroll down and look under the 2017 reports). Implementation of the recommendations has already begun, including the establishment of a temporary curb extension at Rosedale Road and Schwager Crescent.

Rink Repairs

Our community association qualified for a grant from the City of Saskatoon to assist with repairs to the soffit and fascia at the rink shack. The work will be completed later this year.
