

Wildwood is Changing Wards!

In light of the ward boundary revisions presented to City Council on Oct 28, 2019, Wildwood will be moving from Ward 9 to Ward 8 for the upcoming municipal elections.

The WCA invites all Wildwood residents to join us in thanking Ward 9 Councillor Bev Dubois for her exceptional efforts in representing our community since 2016, and we look forward to participating in the election of the Ward 8 councilor on November 9, 2020.

Supporting People, Jobs and Economic Recovery

Budget 2020-21 builds on the strength and resilience of our people, our economy and provides a strong response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the next two years, our government's investment of \$7.5 billion will boost our economy and create thousands of jobs building new schools, hospitals, highways and other infrastructure.

In Saskatoon investments include:

- \$1.3 million for design and planning for the replacement of St. Frances Elementary School
- \$15.9 million to continue a multi-year funding commitment for additional physicians and clinical staff at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital
- \$9 million in additional construction costs at the Jim Pattison Children's Hospital
- \$7.9 million to fund operations for 36 new, permanent acute care medical beds at Royal University Hospital
- \$15 million for an Innovative Care expansion at St. Paul's Hospital
- \$3.8 million to support COVID-19 vaccine research

Through the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program the City of Saskatoon will receive \$35.5 million for:

- Roadside Safety Improvements
- · Neighbourhood Traffic Safety Upgrades
- City-Wide Sidewalk Rehabilitation
